FIREPAC PAYMENT INFORMATION

IAFF members may join the FIREPAC Chairman's Council or FIREPAC Leadership Trust (U.S. and Canada) when registering. The FIREPAC option is available only to IAFF members. U.S. federal election law prohibits the solicitation of non-IAFF members.

Your decision to contribute via this FIREPAC option is purely voluntary and the amounts suggested to contribute to FIREPAC are merely guidelines. You are free to contribute more or less than the guidelines and you will not be favored or disadvantaged by reason of the amount of your contribution or decision not to contribute to FIREPAC.

U.S. MEMBERS

- Your personal, voluntary contribution by personal check or credit card of \$500 provides you membership in the Leadership Trust, a Leadership Trust pin and recognition on the IAFF website. A contribution of \$750 provides you membership in the Chairman's Council, a Chairman's Council pin, recognition on the IAFF website and an IAFF custom weekender bag with leather appointments.
- U.S. members who select one of the FIREPAC options to register must submit a personal check payable to IAFF FIREPAC or use a personal credit card. **U.S. members cannot use a union or corporate check/credit card or seek reimbursement for their contribution to FIREPAC.**
- One person cannot write a personal check or use a personal credit card to cover multiple registrants contributing to FIREPAC.
- Please note that contributions to FIREPAC are not tax deductible and previous FIREPAC contributions and monthly deductions via FIREPAC Check-Off cannot be applied toward the FIREPAC registration option.
